Due to a change in crime reporting that began in 2020, each case could include multiple offenses, all of which are counted. Prior years counted just the highest crime that occurred in the case

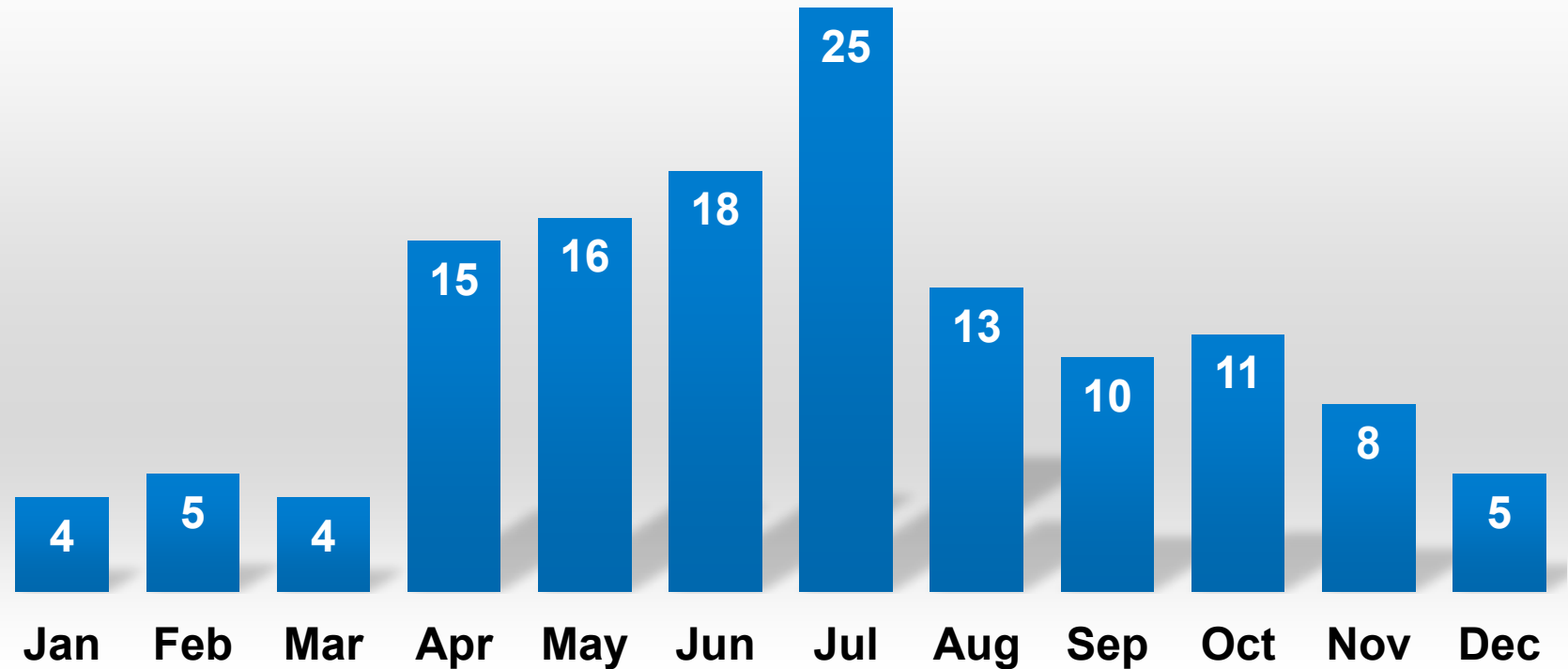
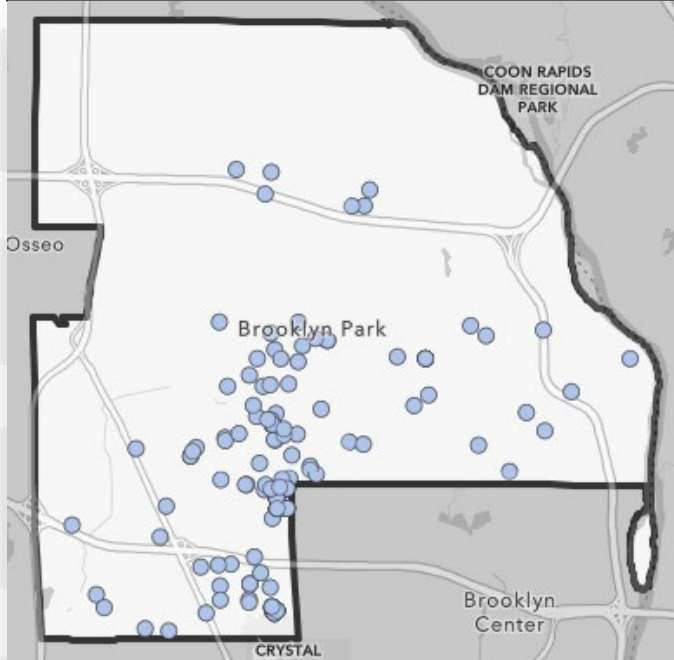
Shots Fired 2020

- 2 People killed



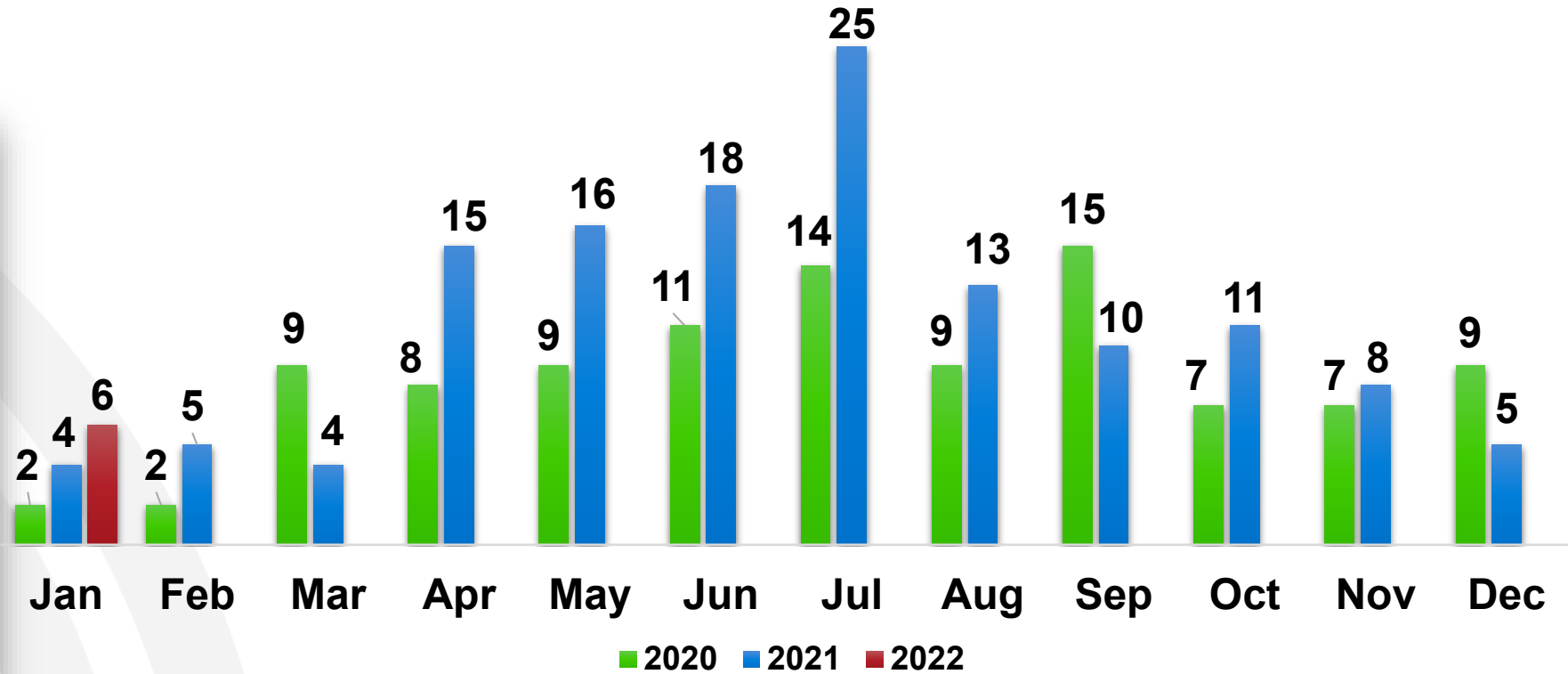
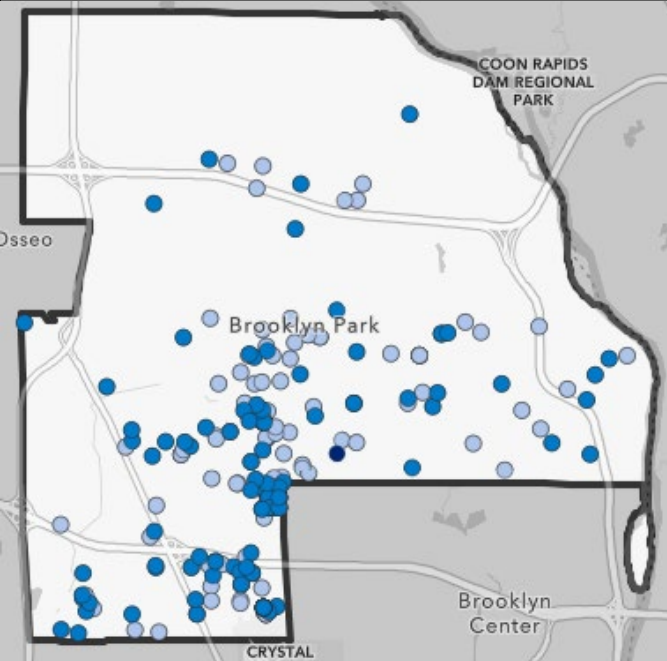
Shots Fired 2021
