Request for Qualifications: Financial Services

Overview: The City of Brooklyn Park is requesting Statement of Qualifications from trained, local finance professionals interested in providing financial consulting services to organizations that will be funded under our American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) and Brooklyn Park Economic Development Authority Community Partnership Program (CPP) community funding opportunity. The city is anticipating contracting with various community-based organizations on COVID-19 response programs that may have significant financial reporting requirements. The city is looking for accounting support for organizations that may need to augment their financial reporting capacity to complete their contractual requirements. This service will be optional for organizations that receive ARPA or CPP funds, and the final contract amount for financial services may vary widely based on the number of organizations who opt to utilize these services. Not all qualified applicants will be selected to provide paid services. The city will enter into a professional service contract with a limited number of qualified applicants and finalize contract deliverables during negotiations. A non-exclusive list of proposed deliverables is below.

Program background: The Community Funding opportunity from the City of Brooklyn Park will provide support to community organizations that are responding to the public health emergency or negative economic impacts caused by the COVID-19 pandemic as well as advancing inclusive economic development in Brooklyn Park. The city will fund community organizations providing services in a variety of categories to serve Brooklyn Park residents. Awarded applicants will enter into an agreement with the City of Brooklyn Park to deliver eligible programs. ARPA and CPP dollars will be used to fund the programs.

Proposed deliverables:

- 1. Over a contracted period, provide financial consulting to selected businesses or nonprofits.
- 2. Assist the organizations with financial reporting on the ARPA funding received and submitting all required financial documents for ARPA and city reporting requirements.
- 3. Support organizations in developing a financial reporting system (if applicable).
- 4. Train staff of contracted organizations on reporting submission requirements.
- 5. Be available to meet with clients during day, evening, and weekend hours. Meetings can be virtual with your own online meeting platform, in person at City Hall, or at the client's public business location during normal business hours.
- 6. Other services may be defined and requested by the partners.

Your Statement of Qualifications should include the following information:

- 1. Applicant name, contact information, and brief description of your business.
- 2. Indicate if you live or work in the City of Brooklyn Park or are local in the region.
- 3. If a business, provide verification of your registration with the state of Minnesota and evidence of good standing.
- 4. A resume(s) of key personnel who will be assigned to do this work.
- 5. Briefly describe your experience working with various cultural communities and the role equity and inclusion has played in how you work with your clients.

- 6. Provide a brief narrative about your/company's interest, ability, qualification, and experience with other related work, including any experience with federal financial reporting processes and working with small community-based organizations.
- Include reference contact information of 2 organizations you have worked with in the
 past doing related work. Indicate the scope of work performed for these
 organizations.
- 8. Hourly rate for service, general meeting availability (e.g. evenings, weekends, or weekdays only), and preferred meeting format (e.g. virtual with your own platform or in person).

The applications will be evaluated based on professional qualifications and experience as well as history of working with diverse clientele particularly in the city of Brooklyn Park.
