REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about March 20, 2025 the City of Brooklyn Park will a request to the HUD for the release of Community Project Funding Grant funds under B-24-CP-MN-1235 of the The Consolidated Appropriations Act, 2024 (P.L. 118-42) to undertake a project known as Zanewood Recreation Center for the purpose of providing teen and young adult programming in an area with an increasing demand for recreational activities and facilities through construction of a building addition at the current location of the Zanewood Recreation Center. Estimated funding from HUD is \$500,000 and the total project cost is estimated at \$10,000,000. The project will be located at 7100 Zane Ave North in Brooklyn Park.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The City of Brooklyn Park has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. Additional project information is contained in the Environmental Review Record (ERR) on file at Brooklyn Park City Hall, 5200 85th Ave N, Brooklyn Park, and may be examined or copied weekdays 8:00 A.M to 4:30 P.M.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the ERR to the Parks and Recreation Department. All comments received by March 19, 2025 will be considered by the City of Brooklyn Park prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds. Comments should specify which Notice they are addressing.

ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION

The City of Brooklyn Park certifies to HUD that Jay Stoebel in his capacity as City Manager consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's State's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the City of Brooklyn Park to use Program funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

HUD will accept objections to its release of fund and the City of Brooklyn Park's certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the City of Brooklyn Park; (b) the City of Brooklyn Park has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to CPDRROFMIN@hud.gov. Potential objectors should contact HUD to verify the actual last day of the objection period.
